For reading and reflection Mark 4:26-34 TM

'Jesus said, "God's kingdom is like seed thrown on a field by a man who then goes to bed and forgets about it. The seed sprouts and grows—he has no idea how it happens. The earth does it all without his help: first a green stem of grass, then a bud, then the ripened grain. When the grain is fully formed, he reaps—harvest time!

"How can we picture God's kingdom? What kind of story can we use? It's like an acorn. When it lands on the ground it is quite small as seeds go, yet once it is planted it grows into a huge oak tree with thick branches. Eagles nest in it."

With many stories like these, he presented his message to them, fitting the stories to their experience and maturity. He was never without a story when he spoke. When he was alone with his disciples, he went over everything, sorting out the tangles, untying the knots.'

In Mark's gospel Jesus shares two parables about growth, patience and hope. As Jesus continues to draw crowds who gather to listen to his teaching, these parables speak about how this teaching is heard and received. The adventure of discipleship is how faith can grow from a small seed to a colossal plant with far reaching branches, if the right environment is provided. What is the environment you are providing?

The natural world speaks to us of God's presence and nature. Tuning in to our place in the realities and rhythms of nature can help us to reflect on our own spiritual journey with God, as does allowing praise to well up within us and lamenting our failure to help God lovingly tend his creation. It is always good to reflect on ways to pick up this urgent task individually and together whilst regularly searching ones self as to how we are helping to grow God's kingdom individually and corporately.
